To achieve these ambitious goals, we have to bring together the interests of local authorities, sports circles and private partners.

We, as political authorities, are focusing our attention in particular on:

- school sport
- support for both elite and popular sport
- planning and innovative use of sports facilities
- hosting sporting events
- and development of outdoor sports.

At the end, in relation to my department in charge of people with disabilities, I would like to confirm that inclusivity in sports for everybody, regardless of physical or mental health, is a goal that we want to achieve. Inclusivity IN sports, and inclusivity THANKS TO sport.

My colleagues join me in wishing you all the best for your professional and private life. We are counting on you to be the new ambassadors for sports as a tool for social cohesion, as you have learned here through a unique multi-disciplinary approach proposed by your professors. And also, to be ambassadors of our unforgettable state of Neuchâtel ©
